VPAG Bonfire – Sun. 5th **Nov., near Hill Ave/ Nutgrove Ave corner:** Our annual big bonfire will be lit at 6.15pm. A range of refreshments will be available, plus a first aid and lost-children's point, but no fireworks are allowed due to park regulations and insurance costs. Helpers will be needed in a variety of roles – more details in a separate email soon.

VPAG Festival: Despite the overcast weather, the Festival was a resounding success last month and huge thanks go to Shaun Hennessy for organising it. £2,363 was raised in total, but substantial extra running costs led to an overall loss of £72. Thanks to everyone who helped in any way on the day.

Coffee van: After a long licensing process, Amir is now able to serve refreshments from his Afista Barista van up by the Lodge and should be there daily excluding Tuesdays as follows: Mon-Fri: 8am-4pm and weekends 9am-4pm.

Outdoor gym: the new gym facilities near the MUGA are being well used but we have been asked to remind park-users that they were designed for adult use. Whilst children are welcome to use the equipment under supervision when it is free, parents should ensure that priority is given to adults.

Supporting visually impaired park-users – Guide Dogs have offered us a free 3-hour training session which will enable you to safely guide someone with a visual impairment round the park and give you a Community Sighted Guide certificate. Please get back to me if you are interested.

Reporting anti-social behaviour in the park: As well as bad behaviour by e-scooter and electric motorbike riders, some stolen motorbikes have been torched in the park, which is upsetting for everyone. Please report all such incidents that you see to the Police - either ring 101 or via https://www.avonandsomerset.police.uk/report/crime-or-incident/#/ - the more reports received, the more action is taken.
