Wildlife Survey: Next weekend! VPAG Wildlife Group is hosting a **'Bioblitz'** wildlife survey on **Sunday 20**th **July** with support from Wild Gardeners and Wild Watch. They will show you how to use wildlife apps like Merlin and iNaturalist to help discover and record the wildlife in the park - or use pen and paper record sheets. Drop in and see them at a stand near Feral Folk Coffee any time between 10am and 1pm.

Risk of fire in hot dry weather: Please take care if you have a BBQ of any sort in the park and ensure it is not in contact with the ground. Apart from setting fire to the grass (and possibly trees), hot BBQ coals left on the ground can cause burns to children and dogs, so ensure you clear up completely afterwards.

Accessibility: VPAG will soon be reviewing how accessible Victoria Park is for people with differing needs. If you have ideas for how the park might improve access for certain users, do let us know.
